Summary of the Scheme

This Landscape Partnership Scheme is composed of 18 projects; no project is completely dependent upon another, but many have close connections and links. Central to the effectiveness of the Scheme is communication between partners, communities and beneficiaries and engagement with key audiences. Three important staff roles will be responsible for ensuring good connections between partners, projects and audiences; these are: Communication and Interpretation **Officer; Community Engagement Officer and** Farm Link Workers.

Our Communication and Interpretation Officer will ensure that the partnership profile is raised and maintained for the duration of the Scheme; they will make sure all partners use consistent language and messages.

Our Community Engagement Officer will work on parish councils in the South West Peak to build a volunteer base; make sure people have their say, are aware of opportunities to get involved, are supported to develop their own local projects and apply for the LPS community grant.

Our Farm Link Workers will be the key to improving working relationships with farmers; hopefully recruited from the farming community they will know the area, know the people and know how to communicate with them and represent their views. Farm Link Workers will facilitate access to farmers' land for other project officers and ensure that farmers have a single point of contact.

Our heritage projects for waders, grasslands, water, field barns and buildings and small heritage will be closely linked through a shared approach to site assessment and evaluation. There will be an agreed process whereby sites put forward for works will be checked against a series of potential constraints or interests, e.g. SSSI, archaeological, landscape, access, ecological, existing agrienvironment scheme agreement, Basic Payment Scheme and cross compliance requirements, and any planning requirements or permissions.

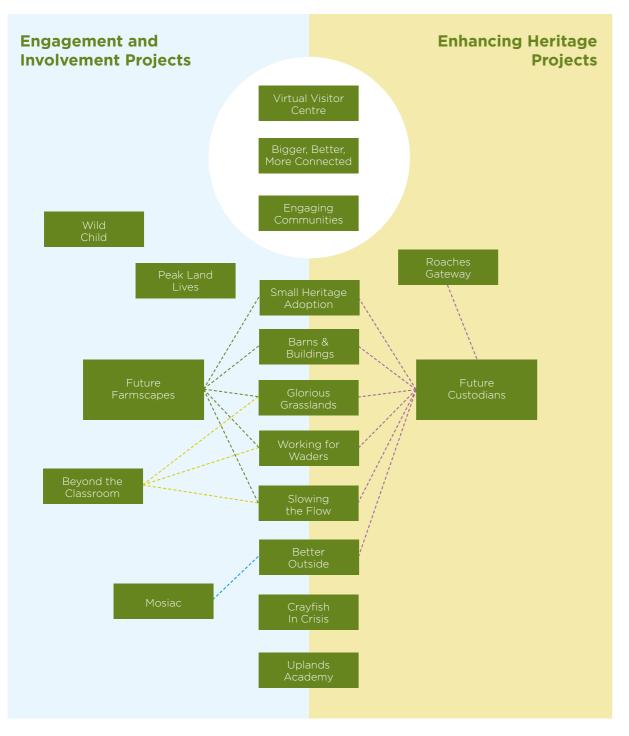
This process will also involve consultation with specialists, and any conflict between the various specialist interests will be resolved by the relevant project officers or referred to their line manager to resolve so that the most appropriate action is agreed and delivered. Any additional opportunities will also be highlighted, and cross checking between the different projects on any one farm will take place in liaison with the Farm Link Workers.

Our apprentice project, Future Custodians, also has a cross-project function. The particular selling point of our two apprentice programmes for Countryside Worker and Farmer is the integration between the two. There will be shared modules for training and work experience so that farming apprentices learn from the countryside worker apprentices and vice versa. Partners have agreed that in order to facilitate this cross-fertilisation the apprentices will be employed to work across all

the ground with residents, community groups and of the relevant LPS projects and partners' wider work programmes. In this way, the work force to deliver access improvements, hay meadow restoration, woody debris installation, repair to field barns and dry stone walls etc will be supplemented by a team of young people who at the same time will be learning of the value of these features in the landscape.

Connections Between Projects

Our 18 projects can loosely be divided into engagement & involvement and enhancing heritage projects, but most fir into both categories. There are connections between a number of projects, for instance, Future Custodians will train a team of apprentices who will work with partners on many of the other projects, while school children taking part in Beyond the Classroom will also benefit from learning experiences with these projects.

Our Scheme will last for five years with projects starting and finishing at different times, as shown in the Gantt chart below.

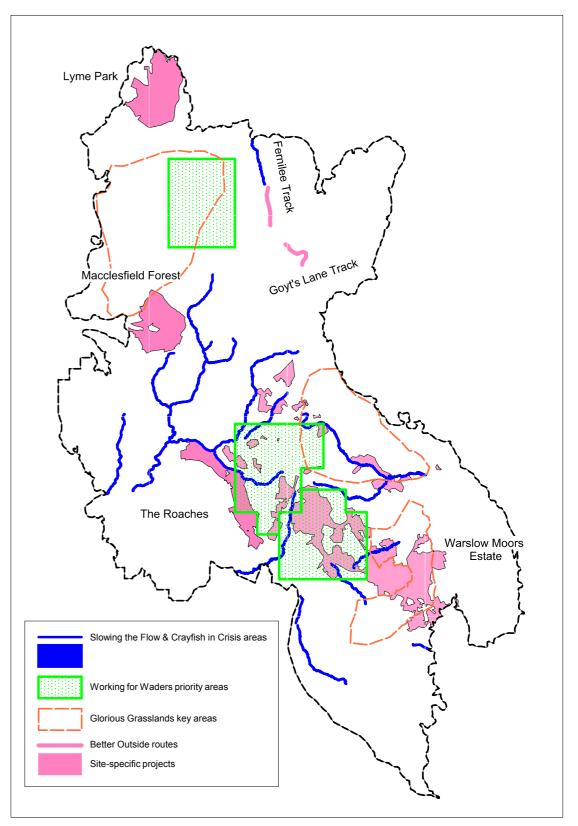
